DRIVING DIRECTIONS FROM BALTIMORE:

7. Merge onto **I-695 W** via **EXIT 49B** toward **I-70/Towson**. 8.5 mi



8. Take the **MD-26/Liberty Rd** exit, **EXIT 18**, toward **Lochearn/Randallstown**. 0.04 mi



Make a left onto Resource Drive (into what appears to be the Liberty Senior Center next to Ruby Tuesdays).

Keep straight and you will see it behind the Liberty Senior Center.

Alternately, you can turn left at Brenbrook Drive and then turn right into the shopping center with Home Depot and keep straight, you will see the building on your left.

7. Turn **slight right** onto **New York Ave NE/US-50 E/US-1 Alt N**. 0.2 mi
Subway is on the right



8. Stay **straight** to go onto **New York Ave NE/US-50 E/US-1 Alt N**. Continue to follow **US-50 E** (Crossing into **Maryland**). 2.0 mi



9. Take the **BALT-WASH PARKWAY** exit on the **left** toward **Baltimore**. 0.5 mi



10. Merge onto **MD-295 N/Baltimore Washington Pkwy N**. 26.0 mi



11. Merge onto **I-695 W** toward **Towson**. 11.0 mi



12. Take the **MD-26/Liberty Rd** exit, **EXIT 18**, toward **Lochearn/Randallstown**. 0.04 mi

Make a left onto Resource Drive (into what appears to be the Liberty Senior Center next to Ruby Tuesdays).

Keep straight and you will see it behind the Liberty Senior Center.
