First Permanent Order of Vowed Catholic Women Religious of African Descent in the World

Our Lady of Mt. Providence Convent is the home of the Oblate Sisters of Providence. The Oblate Sisters of Providence was founded in Baltimore on July 2, 1829, making the order 195 years in existence. It was founded by Mother Mary Lange, OSP who is a candidate for Sainthood in the Roman Catholic Church and who has achieved "Venerable" status in that quest. The Order was founded with the primary mission of educating and caring for African American children.
